CORONATION.

8th of May: Coronation Garden Trail and Royal Tea Party.

Libby Dineley has sent us details on her new book.

The Groves lived at Ferne House between 1563 and 1897. Charlotte Grove kept a diary from 1811 until 1858. She married the Rector of Berwick St John at the age of forty-four and then lived in the very Rectory you may glimpse, after passing the Talbot and taking the bend towards the A 30, high on your left.

Via Charlotte's diaries you may enter the world of early 19th century village life, not any village, but the village of Berwick St John and its neighbouring villages. Charlotte's uncle was Rector of Donhead St Mary, then known as Upper Donhead. She was on visiting terms with the occupants of all the larger Donhead houses, including the MP, John Benett of Pythouse. She talks of the famous 'Chace Cause' when Thomas King of Samways took on the might of Lord Rivers, to be allowed to kill the deer or discourage them from grazing the crops of the valley farmers.

When Charlotte starts her diaries, she is twenty-seven, her life social, the races at Blandford and Salisbury and visits to her aunts at Netherhampton and Zeals. It took a day get to Bath in a private carriage but there she danced quadrilles in the Upper Rooms, much like the heroine of Northanger Abbey. She follows the romances of her five brothers and the ups and downs of their careers. When she marries her concerns are those of a clergyman's wife. They centre round the Church, the village, and the farmers. She runs penny clubs to help provide the poor with sufficient coal and clothing. Nearly everyone was poor. Her husband builds a school. You still pass the building on the corner of Luke Street and Church Street. It was mostly run by the more able children teaching the others, but the boys were out at work by the age of twelve.

Always active, she walks everywhere. Once she marries her excursions take her to Norrington and Samways. She likes to play chess with the second Thomas King's father-in-law, but, highly competitive, very much dislikes the fact he usually wins.

In my two books, 'Talking of Charlotte' and 'Charlotte as Mrs Downes', I have endeavoured to explain the events of her life, liberally quoting from her own words. When she bothers to mention matters of national significance, such as the death of Percival, our only prime minister to have been assassinated, and the various battles of the Napoleonic Wars, I enlarge on them.

The books are available on Amazon as a paperback, a hardback, or an eBook, as written by EA Dineley. The Ludwell Stores will be stocking them.
