STAR GAZING EVENING IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE CRANBORNE CHASE AONB Friday 9 February 2024.

Learn more about the sky at night and our wonderful dark sky environment at this **free** event. Ahead of stargazing in the evening visit our pop-up planetarium in the Sports Centre Hall for a sky tour, the planetarium sessions will operate on a drop-in basis between 4pm and 6.30pm. If a session is full, or has already started, please be patient and wait for the next session - there will be other information/activities to do whilst you wait.

The evening stargazing session will start at 7.30pm. Our astronomers will set up a number of telescopes to show a selection of planets, star clusters, galaxies, and nebulae. Do bring your own binoculars or telescope if you have them.
