Pat Scrivens. Pat lived in Alvediston for almost all her life. Her parents, Wilfred and Dolly Lodge, lived in 1 The Street, now Quince Tree Cottage, where she grew up with George, Betty and Tony. Dolly's parents, George and Jane Compton, ran the Crown inn, bringing up 10 children there. Pat married Michael Scrivens in St. Mary's church in 1976, and they remained in Alvediston until 2016, when they moved to Nadder Close in Tisbury. She worked for the Congleton and later the Sykes families, and was very kind to children, liking to keep up with their news as they grew up. She was always on hand to help with the teas at the fêtes and, with George and Mary Kellow, made a very efficient church cleaning team. Pat settled well in Tisbury and made the most of friendships and the facilities there. She died on 11th March, aged 82, and, after a funeral at the Crematorium on 8th April at 11am, her ashes will be buried with Mike's in St. Mary's Churchyard.

This is easier to maintain, is hard wearing and can be used for different activities and is at a lower cost. We now have the challenge of raising over £25,000-£30,000 to achieve this. The Sports Centre has around £10,000 to raise. Our target is to achieve this by the summer and plan the works in the early autumn.



St. Mary's Church Alvediston





St. Mary's church has changed a great deal over the centuries. The nave is thought to be 12th. century, the chancel 13th. and the transepts 14th. However, in 1585 the church was described as 'down' and was largely rebuilt in the following century, when the ruined vicarage was demolished. Some materials were reused, e.g. the 'piecrust' ridge tiles on the tower roof.

In 1866 T.H. Wyatt made great changes: the north transept was rebuilt, a choir vestry (north) and vestry (south) were built, the chancel was given 13th century features and Victorian tiles, and the pews and furnishings replaced.

The east window was erected in memory of Sidney, Lord Herbert of Lea. Alvediston manor, on the west boundary of the Pembrokes' Wilton Estate, (formerly Wilton Abbey) was sold in 1918. The west window was erected by public subscription in memory of the Rev. Philip Soulieu Desprez, the first resident vicar for nearly 300 years, who oversaw the restoration of the church and the building of both vicarage and school



There are memorials to owners of Norrington in the south transept: Gawens from 1377 and Wyndhams from 1658. The recumbent knight may be of John Gawen who bought Norrington, and the right-hand memorial on the south wall is by Rysbrack. The King family of Samways and some tenants of the manor are remembered in the north transept. In the choir vestry are 2 brasses in memory of Quakers Francis and Jane Fry, Norrington tenants. The memorial to Sir Anthony Eden, Earl of Avon, whose grave is in the churchyard, was commissioned from the sculptor Martin Jennings in 2008 and unveiled by his widow Clarissa, who was buried next to him in 2021.

A major restoration, especially of the roof, took place in 2009 and funds are now being raised for work on the tower and bells, (1630, 1640 and 1811,) and to improve facilities for the variety of village events which take place in our much-loved church.
