## lan Morton 1938 -2023

Ian who lived at Wavertree in Pound Street, Ebbesbourne Wake, for the last 30 years died on 14 October 2023 two days before his 86th birthday. Born in Cardiff to Scottish parents he went to school in Cheltenham. At Southampton University he started to study chemistry but discovered this was not to his liking so transferred to their new course in pharmacology – the study of how chemicals act in the body, usually as drugs. It was to become his life-long preoccupation.

At university he met and married Mary who had grown up in Stratford sub Castle. They went on to have three children Helen, James and Lucy which must have been quite a challenge as Ian studied for a PhD at University College London for three years. Subsequently he became a lecturer at Kings College, London with which he was associated for the rest of his professional life.

Collaborating with one of his ex-students, Judith Hall, Ian wrote a number of books about prescription drugs such as "Antibiotics" and "Tranquilisers" but by far and away their most successful was "Medicines: Over 5,000 Over-the-counter and Prescription Drugs" which has sold an astonishing 1.8 million copies Ian took early retirement and soon after arriving in the village accepted the important rôle of parish clerk; he and Mary used to enjoy walking all the area's footpaths and as a keen amateur acted as judge of the photography entries for the flower show. His other main interests were music and film about which he was very happy to talk, preferably accompanied by his other favourite topic: wine.

In the days when The Ebble was run by a triumvirate of Dennis Gates, Peter Meers and Keith Attenborough Ian would join them for lunch in the Horseshoe every Tuesday. He far out-lived them all.

'The Magistrate' is an adventure of kidnap and revenge, and demonstrates the avenues open to Justices of the Peace to exercise commonsense justice while at the same time coping with the sorry state of the criminal justice system today. "At times", writes Richard in the press release, "government neglect and incompetence continue to undermine the steadfast service of unpaid lay magistrates in our towns and cities, and it is important that wider society gains a better understanding of what we try to do on its behalf".
