6<sup>th</sup> June 2024 marks the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of D-Day when Allied Forces mounted the largest amphibious invasion the world has ever witnessed.

In 1944, Operation Overlord saw more than 5,000 ships and landing craft set down more than 130,000 troops on five Normandy beaches in an action that would bring about the liberation of North-West Europe. To mark the occasion Church Bells will ring out in the Chalke Valley after 6.30 pm.

# ST. JOHN'S CHURCH, EBBESBOURNE WAKE



The first church in Ebbesbourne Wake dated from Saxon times. A stone church first appeared after the Norman Conquest. The west tower in the perpendicular style was added in the fifteenth century. In 1520 Edmond Audley, Bishop of Salisbury dedicated the fine oak rood screen. The earliest known incumbent was appointed in 1239 and diocesan records have a complete list of holders of the living from 1325 to the present day.



The Purbeck Norman marble font (1224) is the oldest feature. The bowl stands on a broad circular column surrounded by four shafts, as if in imitation of piers in Salisbury Cathedral.

The present wood screen was erected in 1889 much improved by stripping back the Victorian paint to reveal the wood in our restoration four years age ,and also when the magnificent blue and red paint frescos was revealed around the nave windows. The stained glass at the east end depict Christ crucified and Christ in splendour and in the 'contre-jour ' morning light bestow quite marvellous colour and luminosity.

The beautiful sonorous five bells, from treble to tenor, were restored and rehung in 1997 having not been rung since 1945 due to decay in the bell-frame. In 2017 there was extensive renovation of the interior with repairs to the exterior of the church, a photograph album showing the works is at the back of the church. The Church is numinous and lends itself very well to visits of quiet contemplation in addition to the joyous services.

# TISBURY FIRE STATION NEEDS YOUR HELP - Can you Respond? For info. www.dwfire.org.uk

Tisbury fire station is looking for new recruits to join their team. We've got a great team here at Tisbury, but we don't have enough people to provide cover all the time. We have had occasions where are neighbouring stations at Shaftesbury and Mere have had to come into Tisbury and surrounding villages to deal with incidents because we've not had enough crew available. We have particular challenges on weekdays and at weekends, and more recruits would fill those gaps.

Our new Station Commander Sarah is really keen that we get the word out to encourage people to consider becoming an On-call Firefighter. Providing cover doesn't mean sitting at the fire station, it's about having a pager and being able to respond when it goes off. You do need to be within a reasonable distance from the station, but you know when you are on-call and can manage your time accordingly. We have Firefighters currently responding from Teffont and Hindon so you don't have to live just in Tisbury to respond.

Many on-call firefighters respond from work during the day. We'd urge anyone interested in joining the Service to have a chat with their employer to see if they would support this. We are more than happy to speak to your employer as well and explain how it all works. As well as giving the local community their help, they would benefit from all the training that's provided. As Firefighters, we learn advanced first aid, leadership skills, health & safety knowledge and sometimes even gain an LGV licence.
